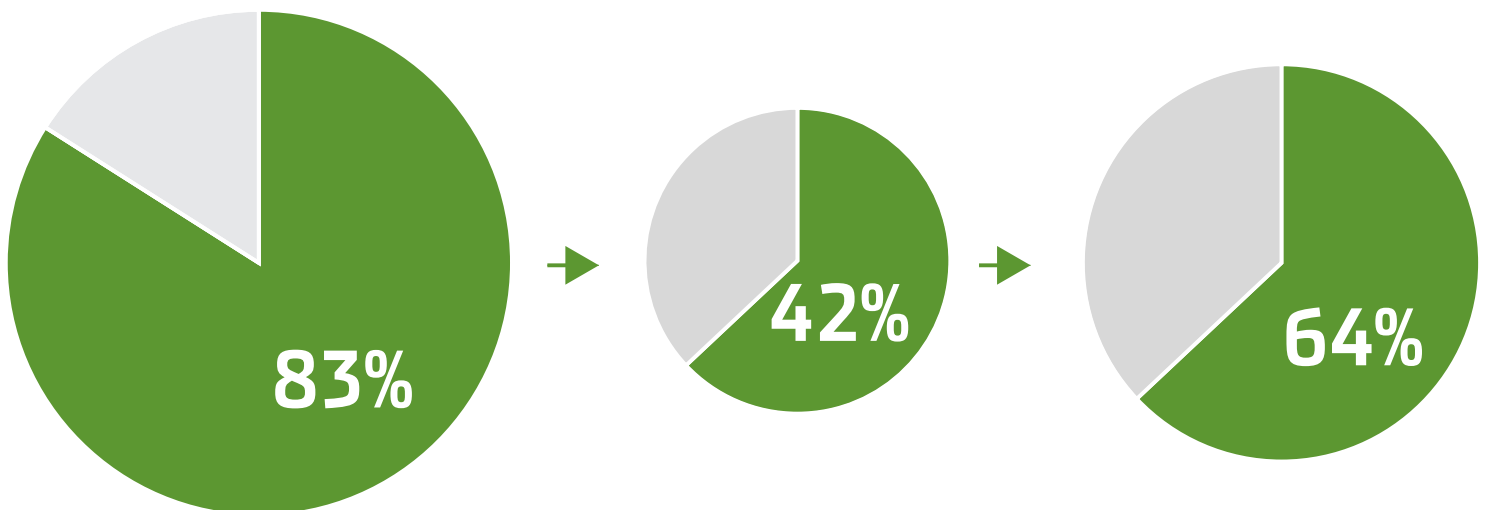

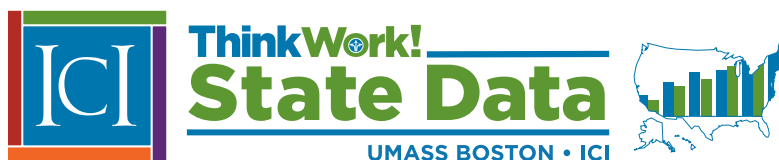
of those who don't have a paid job in the community want one.
